Retaliation and Trade:

- The Trade: Hamby was traded to the Los Angeles Sparks in January 2023, shortly after informing the Aces of her pregnancy. She claims that during a phone call with Aces coach Becky Hammon, it was made clear that her pregnancy was a factor in the decision to trade her. This conversation is a key element in Hamby's case, as it suggests a direct link between her pregnancy and the adverse employment action taken against her.
- Legal and Ethical Concerns: Hamby's lawsuit argues that the trade violated
 her rights under federal employment laws that protect pregnant employees from
 discrimination and retaliation. The legal filing emphasizes that such actions not
 only harmed Hamby personally and professionally but also set a dangerous
 precedent for how pregnant athletes might be treated in the future.

The WNBA's Response:

The WNBA did conduct an investigation into Hamby's initial complaint filed with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) in September 2023. As a result of this investigation, the WNBA suspended Aces coach Becky Hammon for two games and rescinded the team's 2025 first-round draft pick.

However, Hamby and her legal team believe that the investigation was insufficient and that the penalties imposed were inadequate given the severity of the alleged discrimination.

Implications for the WNBA and Women's Sports:

This lawsuit represents uncharted territory for the WNBA, a league that has long positioned itself as a progressive organization dedicated to promoting women's rights and equality. Hamby's case has the potential to set a significant legal precedent that could impact how pregnancy and related issues are handled across all professional sports leagues.
